## Help Me Grow Logic Model (Jan 2012-June 2013)

Program Goal: The overarching goal of Help Me Grow is to support all children in reaching their optimal development. This is done by connecting the key players in an early child's life. Help Me Grow builds upon the strengths of the existing system and enhances the connection of families, child health care providers and community resources. Help Me Grow links families to services, multiple community providers to each other, child health care providers to cross-sector resources and data to policy and decision makers. Objective. Increase connection of families to resources. Decrease the number of children eluding the system through increased usage of a developmental screening tool. Provide real time, accurate information on local community resources to families, child health care providers and community providers. **Population Served:** All families with children birth to age 8 in Utah and South Salt Lake, Utah.

Potential Barriers to Making Changes, Improvements or Implementations

Future funding is unstable, online ASQ has taken much longer to set up than expected, Need to increase call volume, resource database will need a tremendous amount of updating for Salt Lake County resources.

## nort Term Outcome Indicators (Evaluation)

- Number of families connected to Help Me Grow will increase by 200%.
- Expand resource database by 30% with additional HMG resources specific to families.
- Families connected to the Help Me Grow information line with 25% receiving 3 or more referrals.
- Increase attendance to Networking Breakfast by 10%. Increase # of children screened using ASQ by 200%.
- Increase # of children screened using ASQSE by 200%.
- 10% of children receiving at least three consecutive screenings.
- 25% of children receiving at least two consecutive screening.
- Family Events per year: 4 in Utah County and 4 in Salt Lake County.
- Parents will receive a questionnaire at the end of using the Ages and Stages questionnaire.
- Parents will have tool (completed Ages and Stages Questionnaire) to discuss concerns with physician about developmental delays.
- Parents will have tool (completed Ages and Stages Social Emotional Questionnaire) to discuss concerns with physician about social emotional and behavioral delays. Families will be referred to the most appropriate service for their situation

Increase referral of families to Help Me Grow line from child health care providers by 30%.

Increase child health care provider's awareness of cross sector resources.

Number of medical referrals to early intervention will increase by 10%
