The *Help Me Grow* National Center has released a new policy brief, [Help Me Grow Promotes Optimal Child Development by Enhancing Protective Factors](#), that highlights the proven positive relationship between the *HMG* system and the five protective factors specified by the Strengthening Families Framework. "Overall, study findings indicate that support from *Help Me Grow* and subsequent linkage to programs and services enhance protective factors and perhaps even mitigate risk factors," the brief notes.
