Orange County by the Numbers



- 800 square miles
- Population of 3.2 million in 2017
- Approximately 380,704 children birth-five
- 44,026 live births in 2017 (6.3% low birth wt.)
- 16.9% of children live in poverty in 2016
- 15.1% have special health care needs *
- 54.4% of OC parents state they completed a developmental screening **

Developmental Screening Measures

Surveys of Orange County Physicians

2014 AAP survey (N=58) found **74%** were using a tool for development and **68%** using a tool for autism

2016 AAP survey (N=53) on well child visits found **52%** screen at 9 mo., **76%** at 18 mo., and **65%** at 24/30 mo. visits

2018 survey (N=152) by CHOC found **44%** were conducting developmental screening with an evidence based tool

CA Health Interview Survey for Orange County

In 2007, **25%** of Orange County parents state they completed a developmental screening

In 2015, **54.4%** of Orange County parents state they completed a developmental screening

CA Health Interview Survey Statewide

In 2007, **23%** of California parents state they completed a developmental screening.

In 2015, **42%** of California parents state they completed a developmental screening

How Did We Address the Challenges?

HRSA: Healthy Tomorrows Partnership for Children Program

- Awarded to Help Me Grow/CHOC Children's, 2014 - 2019
- Goals:
 - Establish a Developmental Screening Network
 - Develop and launch an OC Children's Screening Registry
 - Link Registry to Electronic Health Records
 - Increase value of care coordination by sharing results
 - Increase number of children who are screened and referred through physician engagement

Leveraging the Network

Developmental Screening Network receives 2016 Capacity Building award from First 5 Orange County. Included technical assistance and 50K budget toward identified need. Deliverables:

Identified the need for a public health campaign related to developmental screening

Finding a Communications Firm

Request for Proposals announced May 1, 2017.

Process:

- Developmental Screening Network workgroup convened to develop and process RFP
- Distributed via Developmental Screening Network partners
- Five firms applied
- Two invited for oral interviews

Public Awareness Campaign

The purpose of the campaign is to inform parents and the public about the value and simplicity of developmental screening and build an expectation that all children are screened for developmental delays.

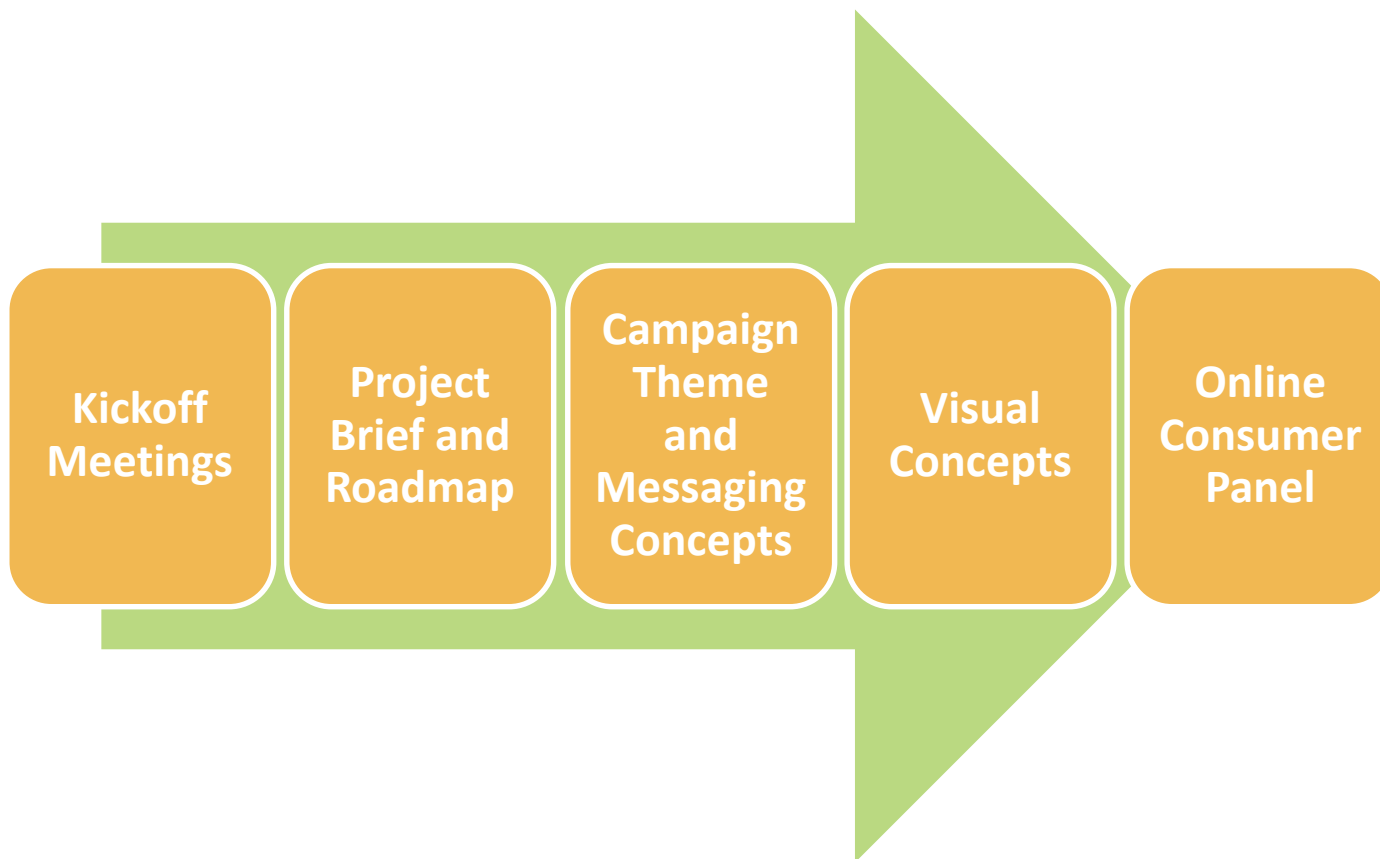
Objectives:

- Increase awareness of the importance of developmental screening
- Increase number of parents that expect and ask for development screening at their child's well child check-ups as recommended by American Academy of Pediatrics
- Provide and ensure consistent methods and messaging that is culturally and linguistically appropriate

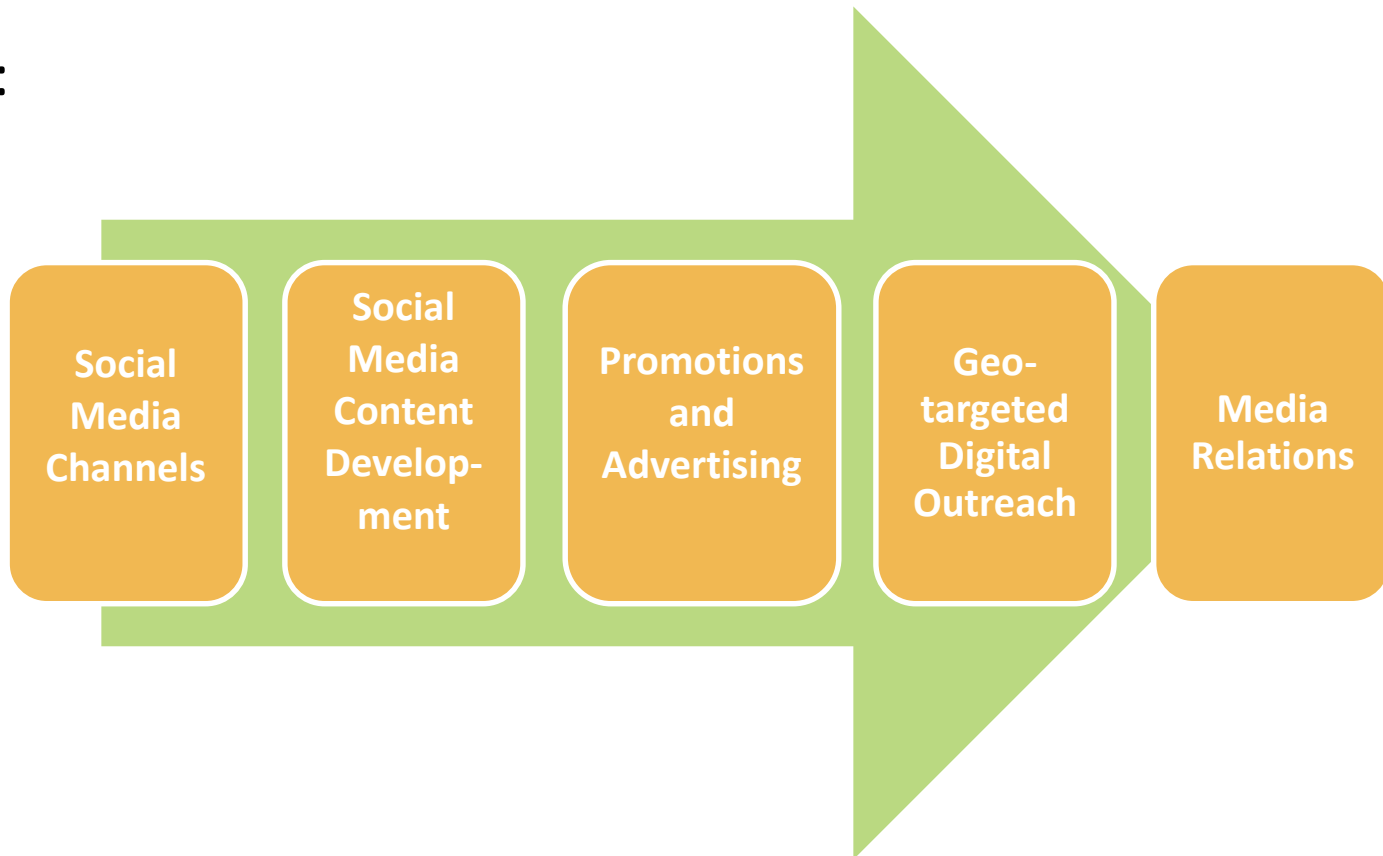

Testing Methodology:

- 200 parents or caregivers in greater Orange County
- Must have child 5 years and under
- At least 60% Spanish language
- Top three concepts tested (3 English/3 Spanish)

Survey Results:

- 200 responses from Orange County
- 73% Spanish language and 27% English
- 61% Female and 39% Male
- 93% Ages 18 – 44
 - 54% Ages 25 – 34
 - 28% Ages 35 – 44

SCREENING NETWORK

To ensure children are on track with their growth, their parents—or guardian—should obtain developmental screenings that are performed by a medical care provider at the American Academy of Pediatrics recommended ages of 9, 18 and 24 or 30 months of age.

As children grow, they should achieve certain milestones, skills marking stages of development for a given age range. Examples of milestones include:

1. Responding to his/her name between 5 and 7 months
2. Crawling between 6 and 10 months
3. Walking between 9 and 18 months
4. Waving “good-bye” between 10 and 12 months
5. Speaking in short sentences between 18 and 24 months
6. Cooperative play with other kids between 24 and 36 months

Parents who want to go beyond what their child’s medical care provider offers can complete a free developmental screening on their own.


The screening can be filled out online for children who are one month old up to 5 ½ years of age and only takes a few minutes to complete.

Once parents complete a developmental screening, they will receive the results. If the screening indicates concerns or questions about a child’s development, parents will have the option of talking with a developmental screening coordinator to discuss the results. Parents will receive additional resources and/or referrals to address any concerns. These results can also be shared with the child’s medical care provider.

Early Development Index

How do we measure kindergarten readiness?

The **Early Developmental Index (EDI)** is a school readiness measurement tool. It provides information about children in five developmental areas that are known to affect well-being and school performance.



Physical Health & Well-Being

The child can hold a pencil and sustain energy throughout the full school day.



Language & Cognitive Development

The child knows how to handle a book and can attach sounds to some letters.



Emotional Maturity

The child pays attention to directions and is willing to help others.



Social Competence

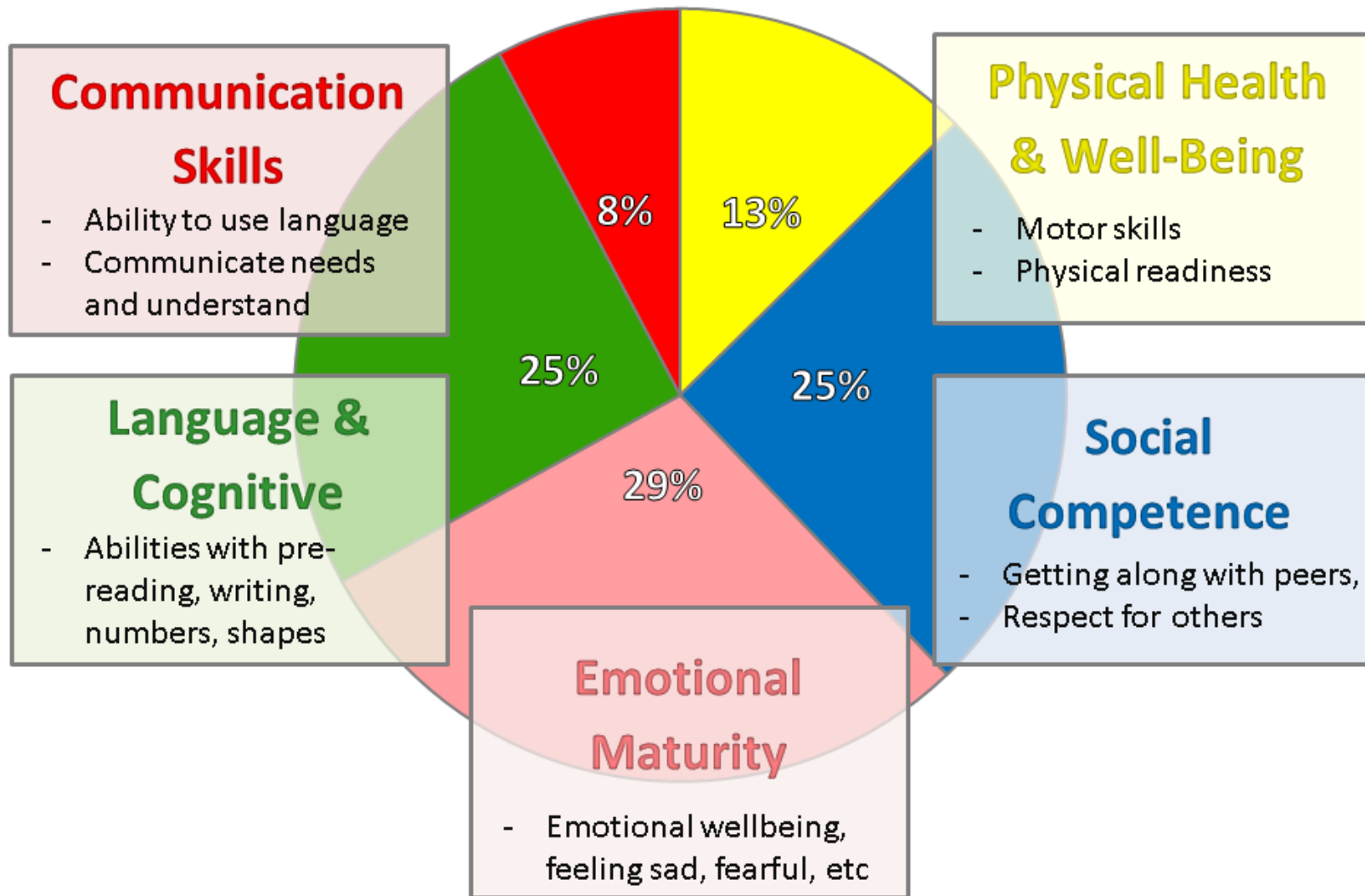
The child gets along with others and follows rules and instructions.



General Knowledge & Communication

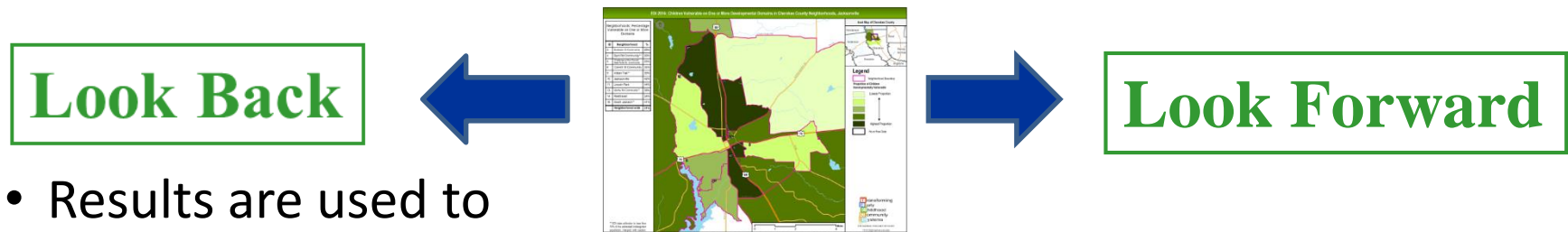
The child can communicate his or her needs and takes part in imaginative play.

Developmental Domains & Distribution of Survey Items



EDI a Population Focus

- A community snapshot of children's healthy development and school readiness
- Informs place-based efforts to optimize the healthy development for all young children



- Results are used to
 - Look back to help collective efforts to prepare children for school
 - Look forward to optimize children's success as they progress through school

Early Development Index (EDI)

- Orange County is the Vanguard site for EDI implementation in the US
- Piloted the EDI in 2008 (5 schools in Newport Mesa)
 - Community planning meetings to “map” the EDI neighborhoods.
 - Consider details of implementation, e.g., teacher incentives, schools to target first, etc.
- First 5 Orange County has contracts with each of the 24 school districts in the county.

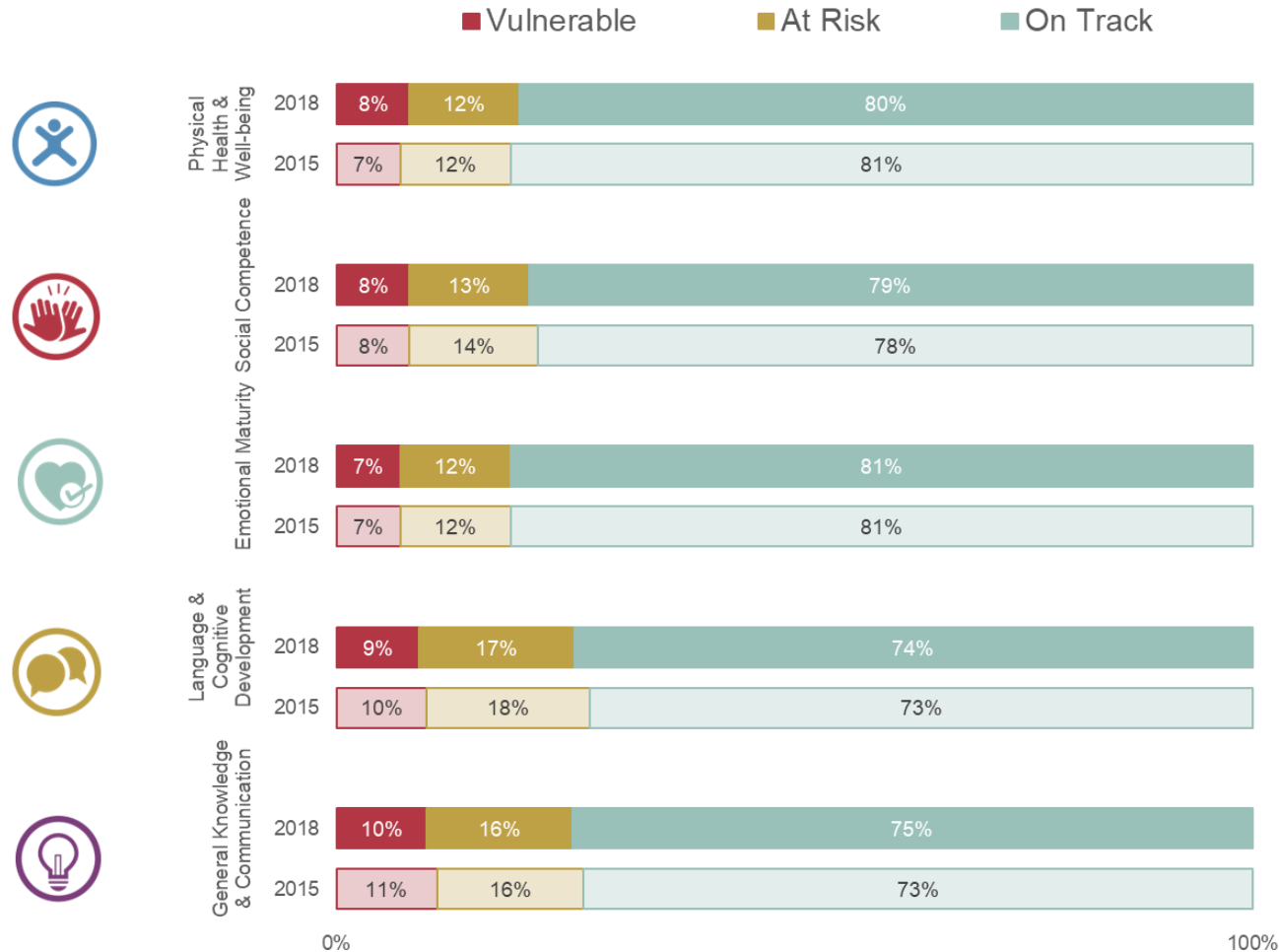

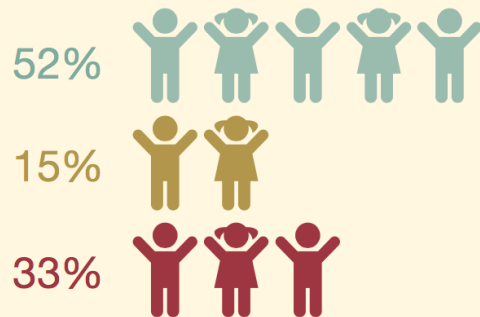

2015 and 2018 Comparison

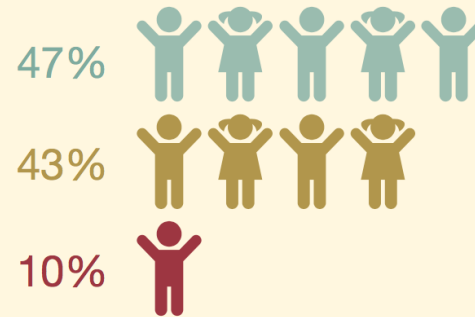

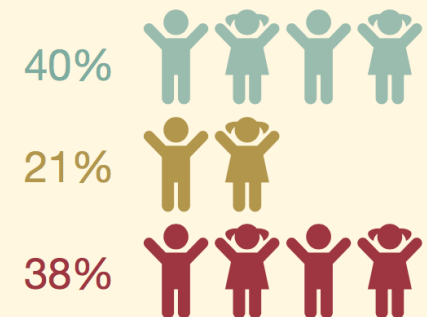
PHYSICAL HEALTH & WELL-BEING: Gross and Fine Motor Skills



SOCIAL COMPETENCE: Overall Social Competence



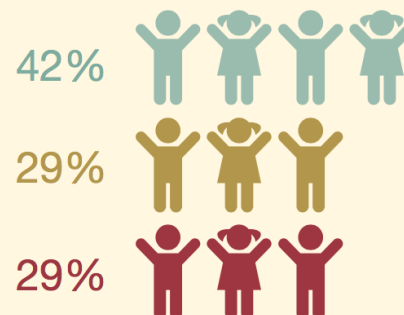
COMMUNICATION SKILLS AND GENERAL KNOWLEDGE



SOCIAL COMPETENCE: Approaches to Learning



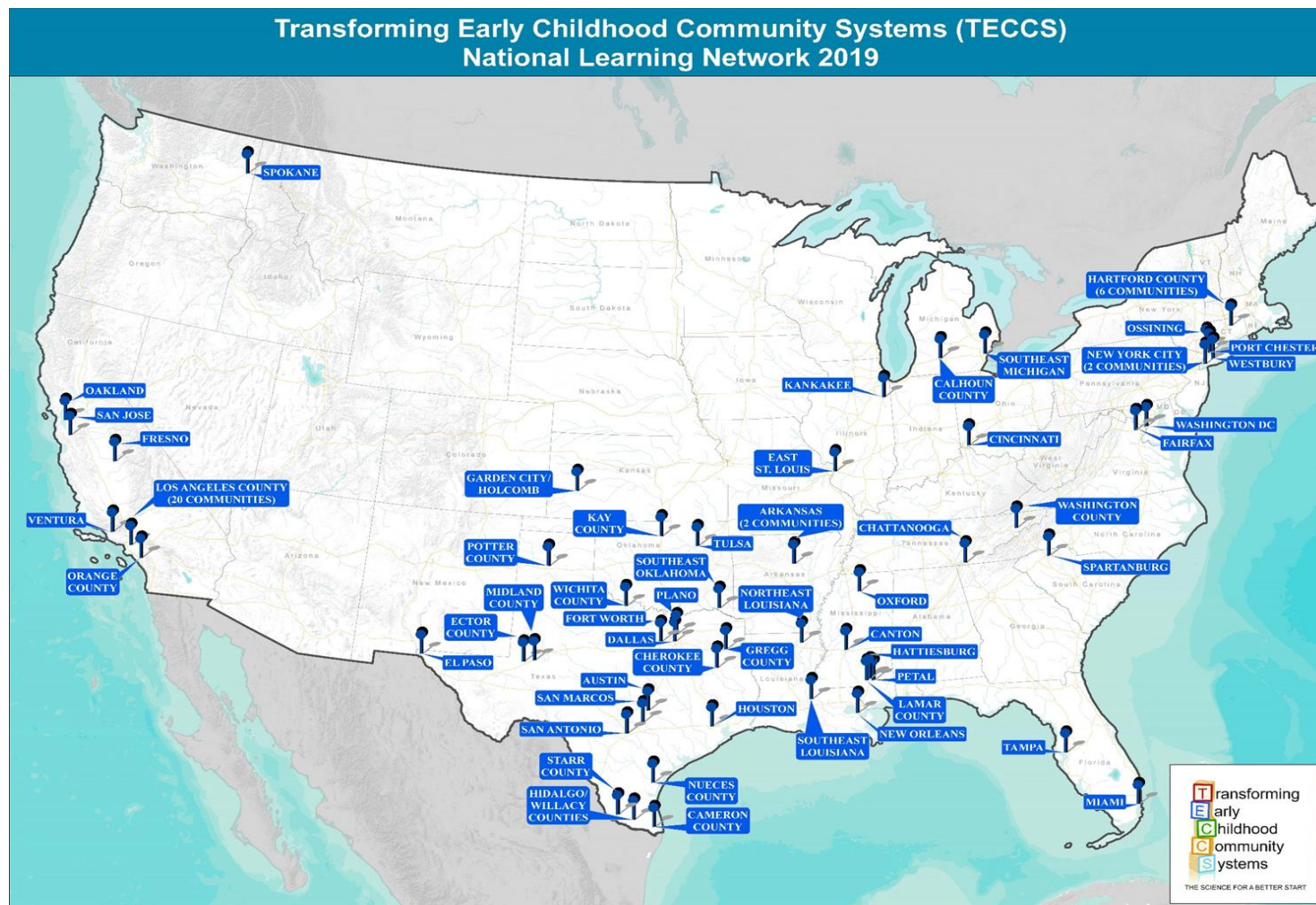

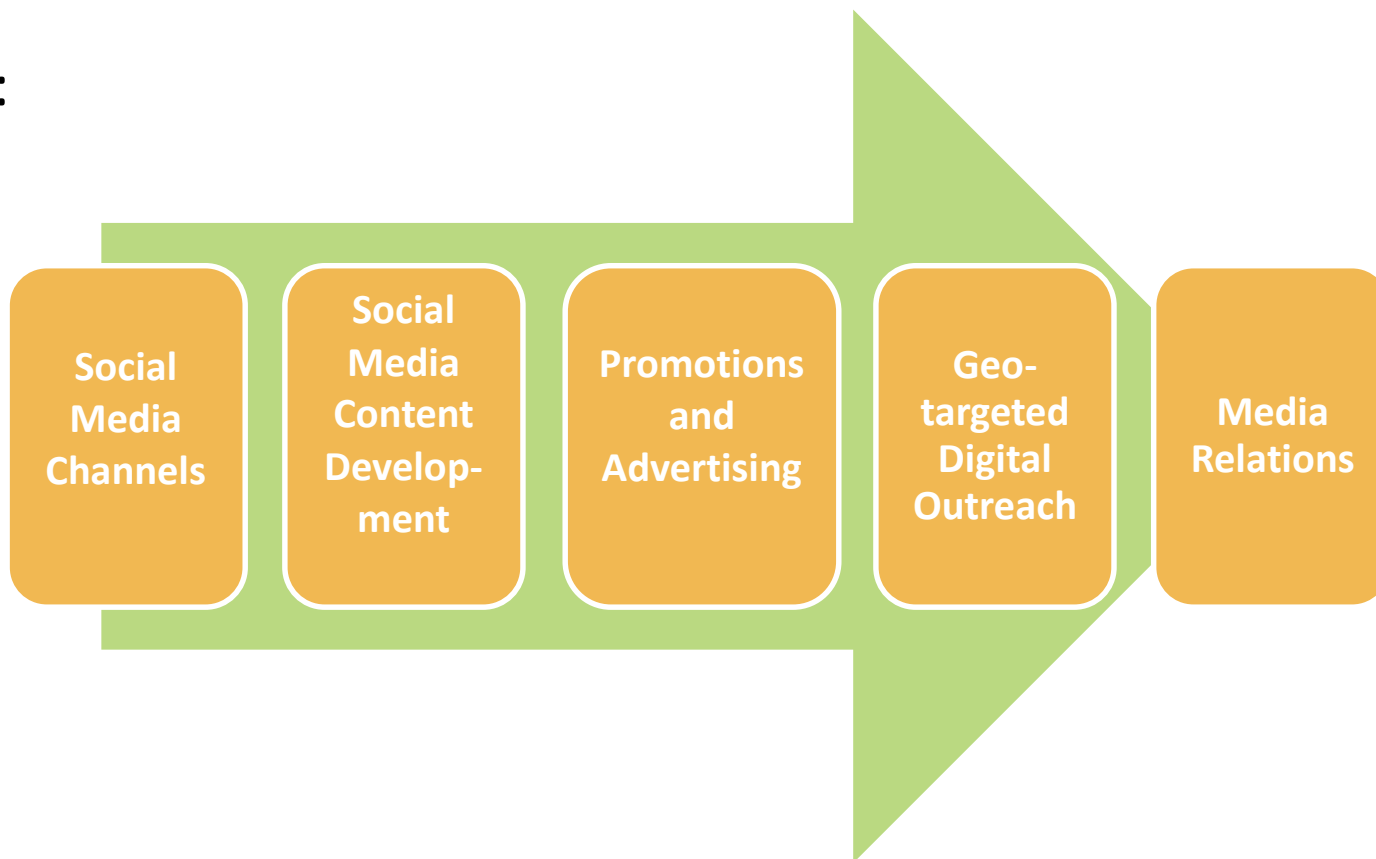

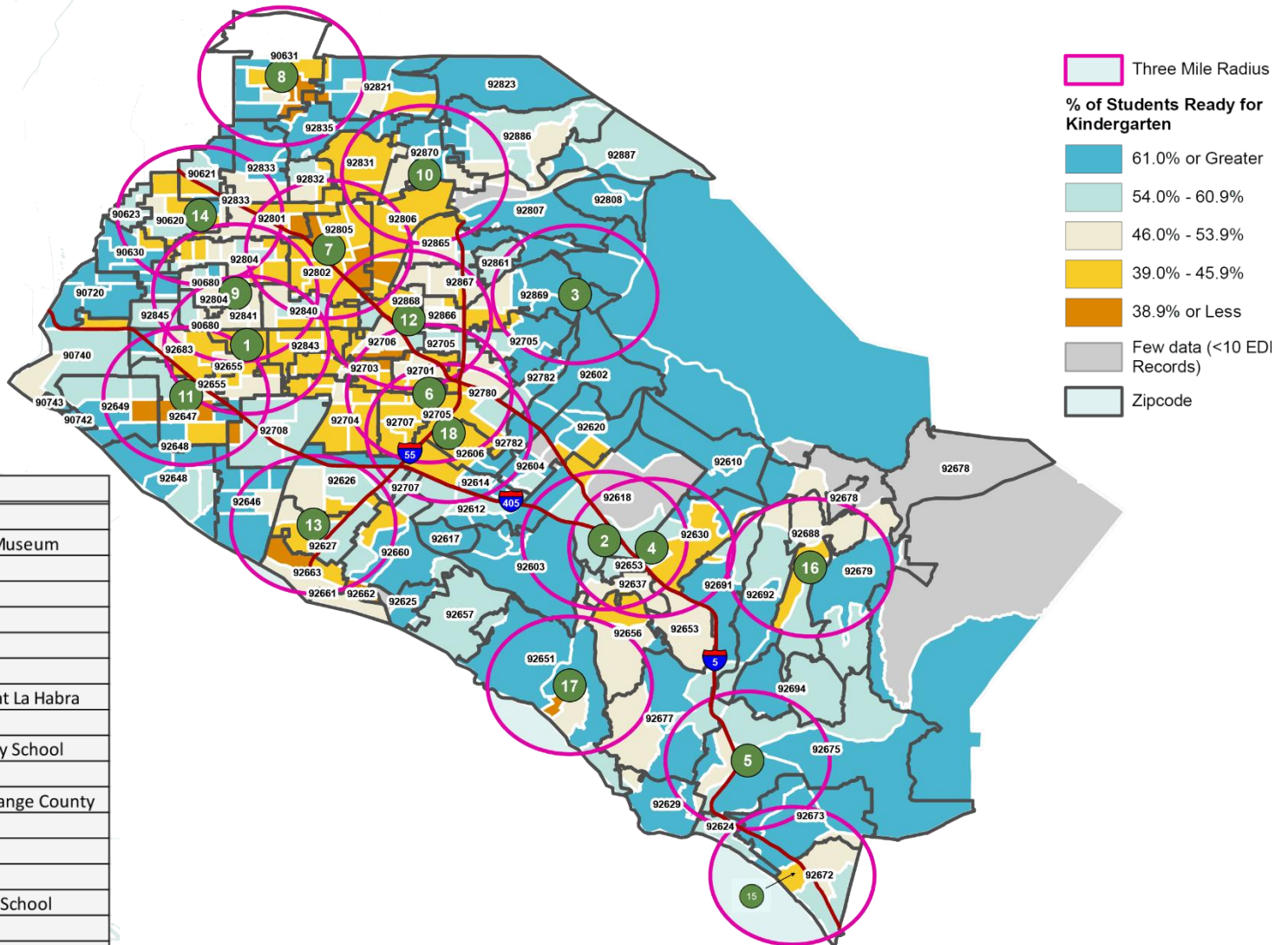
EDI 2017: Percentage of Children Ready for Kindergarten and Potential High Traffic Areas



EDI 2017: Percentage of Children Ready for Kindergarten and Potential High Traffic Areas

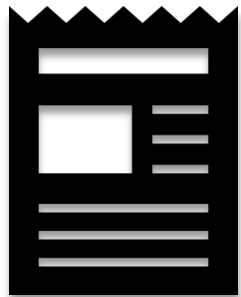

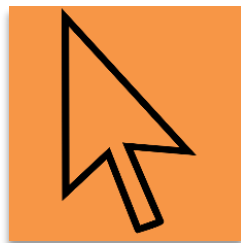
