Network Overview: Policy & Community Change Survey Results

- Total responses: 40
- Total states represented: 17 (57% of our network)
- Top ways HMG systems currently engage in advancing early childhood policy and systems change:
 - Parent Engagement (n=17)
 - Research & Data Collection (n=17)
 - Coalition-Building (n=16)
 - Service Delivery & Programming (n=16)

Survey Results Continued

- Our HMG system currently works with the following levels of government:
 - N=17 local
 - N=16 state
 - N=15 county
- Our HMG system could potentially have the most impact on the following levels of government:
 - N=16 local
 - N=16 state
 - N=16 county
- HMG National Center has the potential to have the most impact on the following levels of government:
 - N=13 state
 - N=15 federal

What We've Heard:

• At our Roundtable discussion last month, we affiliates what supports they were looking for from the National Center. For P&CC, we heard:

Help with continued funding/opportunities

- Support with/for applying for local and state funding opportunities
- Momentum building with national policy makers and funders
- Helping affiliates obtain sustainable funding through advocating for funding being built into national, state, funding streams

- What type of support do you need when it comes to finding, securing and sustaining funding for your HMG?
- Are we talking about advocating for HMG use in existing federal funding streams like state's PDG-5 or ECCS funding, or are we looking for direct/indirect engagement with state legislators? Funding webinars?

Advocacy & Policy Support

- At state and national level
- Momentum building with national policy makers and funders
- Advocate for screening at the national level, Medicaid, billing, etc.
- Support for policy & advocacy work
- Increasing the awareness/"image" of the network at the national level

Affiliate Network Networking Opportunities

- More opportunities for connections with other affiliates
- Hearing stories from other states on what has worked, what hasn't, things they've tried or are trying, etc.
- Best practices sharing from other systems

What kinds of Affiliate Network opportunities would you like to see from this branch of work?

- In terms of P&CC, would quarterly, informal P&CC meeting where affiliates meet to talk about approaches and successes be helpful?
- Is there interest in a Policy & Community Change working group?

At our Roundtable discussion last month, we affiliates what supports they were looking for from the National Center. For P&CC, we heard:

- Support on what to do with data and how to message to different stakeholders
 - Guidance on how to collect data and what to do with it
 - Opportunities to provide context for data collected
- What data are you looking to utilize, and what types of stakeholders are you looking to engage?
 - What data does your HMG system collect currently that could be valuable to pitch to policymakers/funders?
 - What additional data do you collect that could be supplementary to HMG value and impact?

The Future of HMG Policy & Community Change Work

- Based on what we have heard so far, we see the opportunity to provide broader policy & community change supports for things like:
 - Advocating/identifying funding opportunities and sustainable funding mechanisms
 - How to best message HMG and HMG data to policymakers/funders
 - How to use the Model to influence community change
 - Facilitating more opportunities for inter-network connections and communications to support policy & community change efforts
- What do you think is missing under this Policy & Community Change lens?
